"It takes some getting used to coming back over here and settling down again, training for the next event."

The aim of the Tanners, who train twice a week with the Witney and District Swimming Club, is the next Masters Games in Edmonton in 2005.

"The atmosphere in Melbourne was tremendous," said Graham, who only took up the sport between eight and nine years ago.

"The opening ceremony in the MCG was in front of 25,000 other competitors as well as about 10-12,000 others watching from the stands."

"We all had coloured ponchos on and formed a rainbow when we entered the stadium - it was quite spectacular."
